Dear Justice Blumenfeld:

My son is a patient serviced by Harry's Nurse's Registry, Inc., and we have been with Mr. Harry since June 3, 2004. During this time, Mr. Harry has been there for us whenever I call him. And I can call him directly, even though his staff is very helpful. But he is never too busy to talk with me and any of my concerns. I had been with several agencies prior to coming to Harry's and I have never left ever since.

The agency is credible, the nurses that come to my son often talk of how at other agencies they have all sorts of problems, like not getting paid for instance. They however, have never had those problems once they have gotten assignments with Harry's. And I happen to be very familiar with how the nurses work; they work with two or three agencies at once and they are basically only concerned with which agency is paying consistently or paying the most. Mr. Harry has to deal with nurses who lie, steal or other undesirable habits, because they know they are not truly employees and no one can tell them what to do. But somehow Mr. Harry and his staff really care but for the most part, my son gets decent care and being disabled from birth, he is now 13 years of age. It has not been easy for me at all. But Harry's Nurses's Registry, Inc. is there for my son and I and would not like for that to change. There is not much else that life can offer my son.

Please consider my son, and my family when you make your decision regarding Mr. Harry Dorvilier's sentencing and please be lenient with him. Thank you.
