PAMELA K. CHEN, United States District Judge:

Based upon all papers submitted by Plaintiff Claudia Williams (“Plaintiff”) in support of her motion for default judgment and the damages inquest held on April 15, 2025,¹ the Court finds, for the reasons more fully explained on the record, that Plaintiff has met the standard for permanent injunctive relief. Accordingly, it is hereby:

ORDERED that Defendants HARRY’S NURSES REGISTRY, INC. and HARRY DORVILIER (“Defendants”) shall remove all of Plaintiff’s personal identifiable information (“PII”) appearing on any website, social media platform, streaming channel, or any other Internet forum or location, whether hosted by, or published through an account related to or controlled by, Defendants, their owners, officers, management personnel, employees, agents, attorneys, successors and assigns, and those acting in concert therewith.

¹ Defendants defaulted before briefing on damages was completed and therefore failed to submit any papers regarding damages. However, this Court has reviewed Defendants’ submissions throughout this proceeding and provided Defendant Dorvilier the opportunity to question Plaintiff during the damages inquest on April 15, 2025.

ORDERED that Defendants shall also remove all of their Internet and social media posts pertaining to Plaintiff (including posts referring to Plaintiff by her previous names, “Claudia C. Gayle” and “Claudia C. Mathias”), regardless of whether the posts contain Plaintiff’s PII or not.

ORDERED that Defendants are enjoined from posting or otherwise publishing any material related to Plaintiff or her PII on any public forum, reproducing it in any similar manner, or otherwise disclosing it unless required or permitted by law.

ORDERED that any violation of this Permanent Injunction will incur a \$500 fine for each day that this Permanent Injunction is violated. Should any violation continue for more than two weeks, the fine will double to \$1,000 per day. Defendants are jointly and severally liable for any fines incurred in violation of this Permanent Injunction.

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

This Court shall retain jurisdiction of this action to ensure compliance with this Permanent Injunction. There being no just reason for delay, the Clerk of the Court is hereby directed to enter this Permanent Injunction without further notice.
